

Part 2: Booking a course


If you want to book a course at Celtic English Academy, you can:

- Fill in the online booking form on our website: www.celticenglish.co.uk Apply online
- Alternatively, send the booking form and a copy of your passport to info@celticenglish.co.uk

We will answer your questions, guide you through the booking process and help with anything you need before you come to the academy. We can also help you book accommodation through Celtic and arrange transfers to and from the airport.

To book a course, please follow the procedure below:

Step 1	Complete the booking form and return it by email or in person to Celtic English Academy. You can also book online at https://www.celticenglish.co.uk/apply/
Step 2	Email or send a copy of your passport or National ID card. Send a copy of any certificates from previous English course(s).
Step 3	• You will receive an enrolment letter and an invoice once your booking has been processed.
Step 4	 You must a £300 deposit at the time of booking. Fees must be paid in full at least 4 weeks before your course starts or provide us with a letter from your embassy to show that you are sponsored. We will confirm that your payment has been received.
Step 5	If you need to apply for a visa, we will send your visa letter to you once we have received full payment or a deposit and a letter demonstrating your sponsorship.
Step 6	• If you have booked accommodation or airport transfers, we will send you details of these once they have been paid in full.



Part 3: Visas & Immigration

All students coming from non-EEA countries must apply for a UK visa. There are different types of visas depending on how long you would like to study for.

Visa letters & accommodation

The UK Visas & Immigration (UKVI) policy states that any student who books accommodation with a school must supply the address of their accommodation with their visa application.

Student	What you need	What to do
Private Student (non- EU)	If you book accommodation with the academy, you must supply the address of the accommodation with your application.	You must pay your tuition and accommodation fees in full. If you are not staying at the same accommodation for the full duration of your course, you may need to provide evidence to the UKVI of where you will be staying afterwards.
Government Sponsored Students (non-EU)		You must provide a financial guarantee. If you would like Celtic to arrange your accommodation, you must pay for a minimum of 4 weeks' accommodation before you arrive at the homestay or residence address on your visa letter.

Visa refusals

It is your responsibility to submit your visa application in good time. You can check how long you need to make your application by visiting the following website: https://visa-processingtimes.homeoffice.gov.uk/

Status of your visa:	What you MUST do:
Your visa is issued before the start date of your course	You MUST arrive on time to start your course. No refund will be given if you arrive late.
Your visa is delayed in being issued	You MUST inform us before the start date of your course so we can change your course dates.
Your visa is refused	You MUST inform us at least 5 working days before the start date of your course. You must provide proof of the refusal by sending us the full visa refusal notice in writing via email. In this case, we will refund any course fees paid (minus the enrolment fee) should you not wish to reapply for your visa.
Tour visa is rerused	If you do not notify us of your visa refusal before the start date of your course, we will retain the 100% of tuition fee and the enrolment fee.

You may also incur accommodation charges if you have booked accommodation with us. Please see the Terms & Conditions for further information.

Attendance



Punctuality

Please come to all classes and arrive on time for your lessons. We allow 10 minutes from the start of each class for late arrivals.

If you arrive:

Changing your timetable

If you join a class and find it too easy or difficult, you must speak to your class teacher within the first week.

Teacher

- The teacher will be able to advise and support you on the best way to continue your studies and make suggestions for the best class for you.
- If your teacher agrees that you should move class, he/she will then speak to the Director of Studies.

Director of Studies

- You will be informed of your new class, when you start it and where you need to go.
- Students cannot request a particular teacher or class. If you are unhappy with your teacher, please speak to the Director of Studies.

Your study



Class organisation

We always try to make sure there is a balance of nationalities. Also remember that the teacher needs to provide a balance and consider the needs of ALL the students.



Teachers

All our teachers are highly professional, qualified and experienced. Your teacher will usually change when you change your level. Your morning and afternoon teachers are likely to be different.

If you want to contact your teachers, ask them for their e-mail.



Tests

You will be tested weekly. The weekly tests are small, but the results are recorded and used to measure your progress. You will also receive a bigger test half way through the term and at the end of the term. You must achieve a minimum of 70% in the end of term test to progress to the next level of study.



Certificates & Reports

You will be given a progress report twice a term which will give you advice about how to improve.

Additionally, at the end of your course, you will be given a Certificate of Attendance if your attendance is above 80%.



External examinations

The University of Cambridge produces General English language exams at 5 different levels. There are opportunities to take these throughout the year at a local centre.

IELTS exams cost between £175 and £200. If you would like us to help you book your exam, please speak to our Academic team.

Class rules



Please keep your mobile phone on silent. Do not answer your phone in class or send text messages!



Only speak English in the class and around the academy.



Please come to all classes and arrive on time for your lessons. Your attendance MUST remain above 80% every week.



Please put all rubbish in the bins provided. Do not leave anything on the desks!



Please take your coffee cups with you and pour anything you don't drink away. Only put EMPTY coffee cups in the bin!



Please do your best to get on with your classmates and teacher. Please be respectful to all students and staff at the academy!



Remember that making mistakes is a good thing because they will help you learn.



Always ask the teacher if there is something you do not understand. Remember the teacher is there to help you.



Please do not leave any valuables (money, phone, laptop, etc.) unattended in your classroom or in the student lounge. It is better to keep everything with you at all times.





Holidays

Celtic is closed for two weeks at Christmas/New Year (see page 4) and on bank holidays. The rest of the time, the academy is open. If you would like to take a holiday, you MUST speak to Operations team first to arrange your holiday.

Students sponsored by their embassy must also get approval from their supervisor and give this to the Operations Manager.

If you are studying for 1 - 12 weeks	You are not allowed to take a holiday. Any time off that you take will be considered unauthorised.
If you are studying for 12 – 23 weeks	You can take a holiday for 1 week, but it MUST be approved by the Operations team before you take it. You MUST give at least 10 working days' notice. Holidays can be taken for whole weeks only
If you are studying for 24 – 35 weeks	You can take up to 2 weeks holiday, but it MUST be approved by the Operations team before you take it. You MUST give at least 10 working days' notice. Holidays can be taken for whole weeks only (minimum 1 week, maximum 2 weeks)
If you are studying for 36 - 44 weeks	You can take up to 3 weeks holiday, but it MUST be approved by the Operations team before you take it. You MUST give at least 10 working days' notice. Holidays can be taken for whole weeks only (minimum 1 week, maximum 2 weeks)

If you do not speak to arrange your holiday with the Operations team, you will be marked absent and no note will be recorded. You will also need to get a holiday letter from reception to keep with you when you are on holiday.

Any holidays that you take (up to a maximum of two weeks) can be added to the end of your course providing you have enough time left on your visa for this to happen. If you do not have the time left on your visa, your holiday weeks will not be added, and no refund will be given for this time.

You can always find a member of staff either at reception or in the academy office (on the top floor of our building). If you would like to speak confidentially, please just let us know. If you have a complaint, you can follow our complaint procedure. You can find this on the notice boards around the academy. If someone in your class or accommodation is making you unhappy, then you must tell us so that we can help you.

Dealing with homesickness

It is a big change to be live away from home with the added pressures of studying in a foreign country. It can be exciting to study in a new country but it is also natural to feel a homesick sometimes. It is important to remember that you are not alone.

Keep in touch with your friends and family

Technology makes it easy to stay connected – even when you are on the other side of the world. Text messages, Zoom and social networks give everyone the opportunity to stay in touch.

It is important that you keep the connection to your friends and family back home while you are away. But be mindful of how much contact you are having as too much can really make you feel like you are missing out on things.

Do not spend too much time in your room

Staying in your room all the time might seem like a good idea, but it can make you feel worse. Joining our social activities, mixing up your study routine with trips to the library, spending time outdoors and organising day trips to local attractions are all great ways to spend your time.

Food

Missing your favourite foods can not only make you hungry, but it can also add to your homesickness. Due to the multicultural nature of Cardiff, you will find lots of foreign foods in speciality markets, restaurants and supermarkets. You may also try the local cuisine. Maybe your new favourite food will become Marmite on toast, fish and chips or welsh cakes.

Connect with your homestay host and new friends

Getting to know your host family and our new friends at Celtic English Academy. Feeling comfortable around them is one of the best solutions to feelings of homesickness. Maybe your host enjoys evening walks so you could join them. If someone in your accommodation loves to cook and try new foods, teach them how to make one of your favourite meals from home. Any positive interactions you have will help you build a solid relationship with your host and new friends.

Bring home comforts

It does not matter if it is a photo of your hometown, a key ring, or something you've had since you were a child, we all have things that make us comfortable. Bring them with you to your homestay if you need to.

Ask for help

Talk to your homestay host, our student support officers, teachers or anyone from our staff if you need help with homesickness. We have all felt homesick at one time in our lives. We will do our best to help you.

Stay healthy

Keeping your body active is a great way to keep your mind happy. A daily walk or run is a good way to stay healthy. There are many beautiful parks, trails and places to discover in Cardiff.



Safety advice

Cardiff is a very safe and friendly city, However, like everywhere in the world, you need to follow everyday safety rules when you are out.

- Keep your student card with you all the time
- Be careful with your bag, money and mobile phone.
- Do not carry or show large amounts of cash. You can use your credit/debit card almost everywhere and cash machines (ATMs) are available at lots of locations.
- Make sure your mobile phone is fully charged when you leave the home
- Always have the phone number of your host (if you are staying at homestay) and the academy's emergency phone number (+44 (0) 7803495154) saved in your phone. It is a good idea to have them written on a piece of paper in case your phone runs out of battery.
- When you are in town, always be aware of your surroundings.
- Follow the rules of road safety. Do not forget, we drive on the left here, so be careful when crossing the road.
- Try not to walk home alone when it is dark. If you do, always try to walk on the main streets and well-lit areas.
- Never speak or meet up with people you do not know. Leave if you feel uncomfortable or something does not seem right. Do not accept any presents from strangers. Do not worry about being rude or impolite.
- Please report any suspicious behaviour to us at academy, to your host or to the police.

Falling behind with your studies

It is important that you attend your classes on a regular basis and do your homework. However, falling behind with your studies can happen to some of the best students. It can make you sad, anxious or even angry, but it is important to know that there are many ways to catch up and there is help available.

Here is some advice to help you.



Ask your teachers for help

If you are falling behind with your coursework, make sure you ask your teacher for help. Your teacher will support and help you. Letting your teacher know about your situation early can help them help you. They might be able to offer advice, extra support and resources. If you do not feel comfortable speaking to your teacher, you can always speak with our academic team.



Speak to other students

Speaking with other students can make you feel less isolated and more motivated to do your work. Ask other students about their approaches to study. This may give you ideas which help you. Arrange study groups or discuss topics together.



Think about where you are now

It is easy to look at all the things you have to do, without looking at how far you have already come. Take a moment to reflect upon your achievements.



Remember – you do not have to be perfect

It is impossible for any student to be 100% perfect. Do as much as you can and keep your goals in sight. The most important part is to attend all your classes and not to miss your classes. Study a little bit every day and you should soon be well on your way to catching up with your studies.

Part 8: General information



First aid

A first aid kit is kept in reception. If you have an accident in the academy, please go to reception. One of our trained staff members will treat your injury or arrange further medical help.

Trained first aiders wear a green first aid name badge.

On school trips, the activity leader carries a first aid kit.



Smoking

Smoking is forbidden in all areas in the academy. If you wish to smoke, please move away from the main entrance doors of our buildings and try to stay away from the entrance doors of other buildings on the street.

There are ashtrays provided for you to put your cigarette ends in. PLEASE USE THE ASHTRAYS!



Fire alarms

We test our fire alarm once a week. This happens between 11 and 11:30 every Wednesday. The alarm usually rings for less than 10 seconds and you do not have to leave your class.

If the alarm sounds more than 10 seconds at any time, you MUST leave the building as quickly as you can. Follow the green signs and leave through the back door. Your teacher will take you to a safe place outside the building.



Notice boards

There are notice boards around the academy buildings. Please check the notice boards daily for information about any changes to your class/room and information about social activities.



UK law

As well as the academy rules, you should also be aware of UK laws which might be different to the laws in your country. For example, did you know that if you drop rubbish in the street you might have to pay up to £100?

Please be aware that the following things are illegal in the UK:

- Not wearing a seatbelt in a vehicle (e.g. a bus, car, or taxi)
- Cycling a bike in the night without lights
- Cycling on the pavement
- Downloading music illegally
- Smoking in public places
- Buying alcohol under the age of 18

Bullying

Celtic does not tolerate bullying. Bullying can be:

- Unwanted physical contact
- Jokes
- Offensive language
- Hurtful letters/e-mails/text messages
- Social exclusion
- · Sexual harassment
- Pressure to take alcohol or drugs

Putting pressure on someone else to agree with extreme political or religious views is also bullying. If this happens to you, please tell a member of the academy staff.

A student who does not stop bullying other students may be asked to leave the academy.



We do not recommend signing up to a tenancy contract without viewing the property, meeting any possible housemates and ensuring you are happy with the contract.

Bus

Train

Travelling to airports / other cities

There is a regular shuttle bus service between <u>Cardiff Airport</u> and the Rhoose Cardiff International Airport railway station. The journey takes approximately 10 minutes and then you can take a train to Cardiff city centre.

National Health Service

If you come from a European Economic Area (EEA) country, you and your family qualify for full NHS treatment. If you are Swiss, you will have the same healthcare eligibility as EEA nationals. If you are not from an EEA country, check this table:

Medical treatment	
If your course lasts for 6 months or more:	 You are entitled to free medical treatment from the beginning of your stay If your family is living with you as dependents, they will also be entitled to NHS treatment
If your course is less than 6 months:	 You will have free accident and emergency hospital treatment You will have to pay for any other treatment as a private patient You should take out medical insurance for the duration of your visit to the UK
NHS treatment free of charge:	 Treatment given in an accident and emergency department or casualty department Family planning services Treatment for certain communicable diseases Compulsory psychiatric treatment

Registering with a doctor (GP)

When you arrive in Cardiff it is important to register with the doctor, if you need to. We particularly recommend registering at your local GP if you are staying in Cardiff for more than 3 months. Do not wait until you become ill to register! Celtic English Academy will give you a letter to help you register at the doctor and will suggest which surgery you should go to depending on where you live.

- Urgent doctor appointments are available during working hours (09:00 17:00).
- There is an out of hours emergency doctor service available during the evening, nights and weekends.
- Students from non-EEA countries should purchase their own medical insurance before travelling and should bring a copy of the insurance documents with them.

Medication

If you are taking any medication, you should bring this with you in correctly labeled packaging. If you must go to the doctor or the hospital, they will ask you about your medication, so please make sure you know what it is called.

Health

NHS waiting times can be quite long. In a non-emergency, please refer to NHS direct before going to hospital https://www.nhsdirect.wales.nhs.uk/ where you can check your symptoms and ask questions to medical professionals.

Boots Pharmacy offer a wide range of health and medical advice. They can vaccinate against many diseases and illnesses, the staff are trained to advise about which medication to take, which you can also buy in store. You can also get eye tests and hearing tests in store.

The nearest Boots Pharmacy to Celtic English Academy is on Queen Street.


